

County Library Sets a Record

> Highest monthly circulation figure in the 50 year history of the Los Angeles County Public Library was achieved during March despite a decline in reading of fiction works by adults and children alike.

Total circulation for March was 919,949. In addition to being the highest monthly circulation figure it was the first time borrowers checked out over 900,000 books and magazines in any one month, Geller said.

Highest previous circula-tion was March, 1962, when the figure reached 899,195. Total circulation through the County Library's 110 com-munity and institutional branches for the nine months of the fiscal year now stands at 6,807,315. which represents a gain of 221,421 over the same period of last year.
