CHEESE AND HAM SOUFFLE

- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 2 cups milk
- 4 ounces Blue cheese, crumbled
- 8 ounces boiled ham, chopped
- 6 egg yolks, slightly beaten
- 1 In-Er-Seal Packet of waverly wafers, finely rolled, about 1½ cups
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 2 teaspoons dry mustard
- 6 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Melt butter or margarine in a saucepan. Add flour, stirring constantly. Add milk gradually stirring until mixture comes to boil and thickens. Stir in crumbled Blue cheese, chopped ham, egg yolks, waverly wafers crumbs, pepper and dry mustard. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold into egg mixture. Pour into a buttered 6-cup soufflé dish. Bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) for 50 minutes or until set and brown. Serve immediately. Makes six to eight servings.
