The pictures of that world that flash through the mind as Rev. Zimmerman talks range from a four-year-old boy who saw beauty in people worshipping together to the shapeless outline of a church in ruins in Africa.

The quick contrast from a busy, even bustling, office to the quiet of a sensistive, imaginative, questing, mind outlines clearly the mission of a pastor in the lives of neople today, and defines hy that office is not an office, but a study.

There is a curious mixture of the businessman and the comtemplative quiet of the sanctuary in the life of a pastor. He must briskly and efficiently bring the material needs of his people in order to serve their spiritual

As Rev. Zimmerman puts it, "you must have the tools, you must create physical surroundings of beauty to nourish the spirit and to give your people pride in what they see.'

Rev. Zeimmerman has done this amply and well in the 22 years since he began to minister to the spiriual needs of his people back in a country church in a country town in Colorado. It is, in a sense, ironical that a pastor should begin his career in a town called Last Chance, but that is just what Rev. Zimmerman did. "Since ordination," says Rev.
