Land in Japan

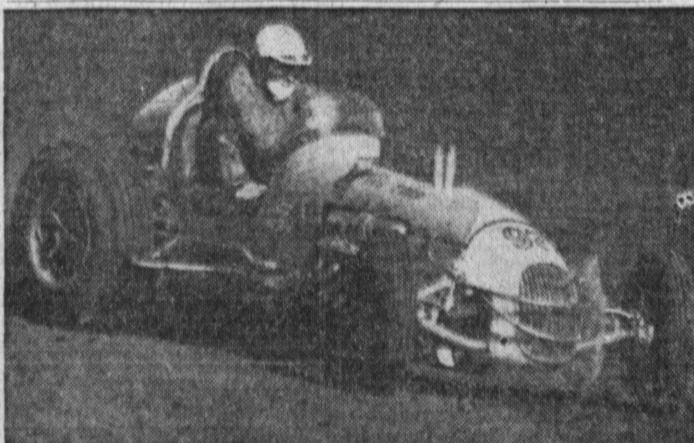

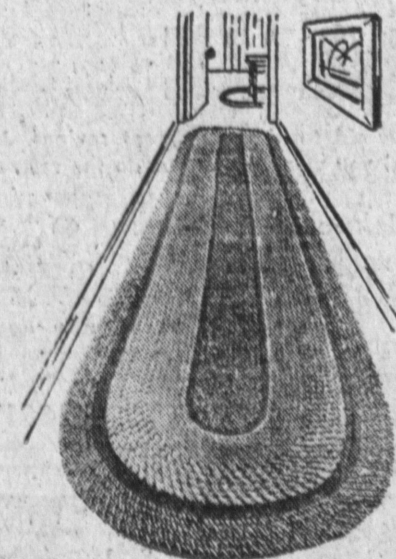
