

Keep Americans 'Sold' on World Trade, Banker Urges

Peter Weber, vice-president of the International Trade Club, addressed the South Torrance Lions Club at its Wednesday breakfast meeting at the International Pancake House, Del Amo Center, Torrance.

A member of the 1963 World Trade Week speakers bureau, he discussed the importance of keeping Americans "sold" on the importance of world trade to the American economy.

He reported that the con-

cern over balance of payments and the wide publicity of the Trade Expansion Act have focused attention on U.S. foreign commerce, but that Americans still need assurance that world trade is in their best interest.

The 37th annual World Trade Week May 19 to 25

will be held to remind Southern Californians world trade is a billion dollar industry here, directly responsible for more than 250,000 jobs.

The observance is sponsored by the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with the ports of Los Angeles and Long

Beach, Los Angeles International Airport and the Los Angeles Board of County Supervisors.

Weber, assistant manager of the Wilmington branch of United California Bank is a former Swiss banker, a graduate of the college in Neuchatel, Switzerland. He was born in London.
