

### Richard Hollins Captures EC Top Chemistry Award

Richard Allen Hollins, chemistry major from Torrance, will receive the annual general chemistry award as the outstanding student in General College Chemistry at El Camino College, William T. Mooney, assistant director of instruction, announced today.

Hollins will be the El Camino College representative in the Chemical Rubber Publishing Company's annual achievement award program and will sit for a two-hour examination in the middle of May.

The El Camino representative in this examination competes against the general chemistry award winners of most of the colleges and universities in the seven western states.

Hollins was a 1962 graduate of Torrance High School. He is in his second semester at El Camino College and plans to transfer to the College of Letters and Science at UCLA as a chemistry major after completing two years of work at El Camino. He was the highest ranking student this year on the Chemistry 1A placement examination.

The award is based upon Hollins' work in Chemistry 1AX last semester with James Campbell, instructor, and his work in Chemistry 1B to date during the current semester. Dr. Jack C. Hileman, instructor.

This is the seventh year that El Camino College has participated in the national

award and examination program. Three of the local award winners have placed high in the western state standings, Rudolph Johnson, now a microbiology, pre-medicine major at the University of California, Berkeley, was western states winner in 1961.

Jerry Buchholz, also a former Torrance High School

graduate and now scheduled to receive his Ph.D. degree in chemistry from the University of California at Berkeley this June, tied for second place in 1957.

Gary Hakanson, a third local award winner from Torrance High School and now a naval aviator, was named third in 1959. Other El Camino College award

winners were Don McCollom, a physics major at UCLA, in 1958; and Frank Riekman, a January 1963 straight "A" graduate in engineering from UCLA, in 1960.

Rollins resides at 2567 Monterey St. in Torrance and studied chemistry at Torrance High School with Robert McKnight.

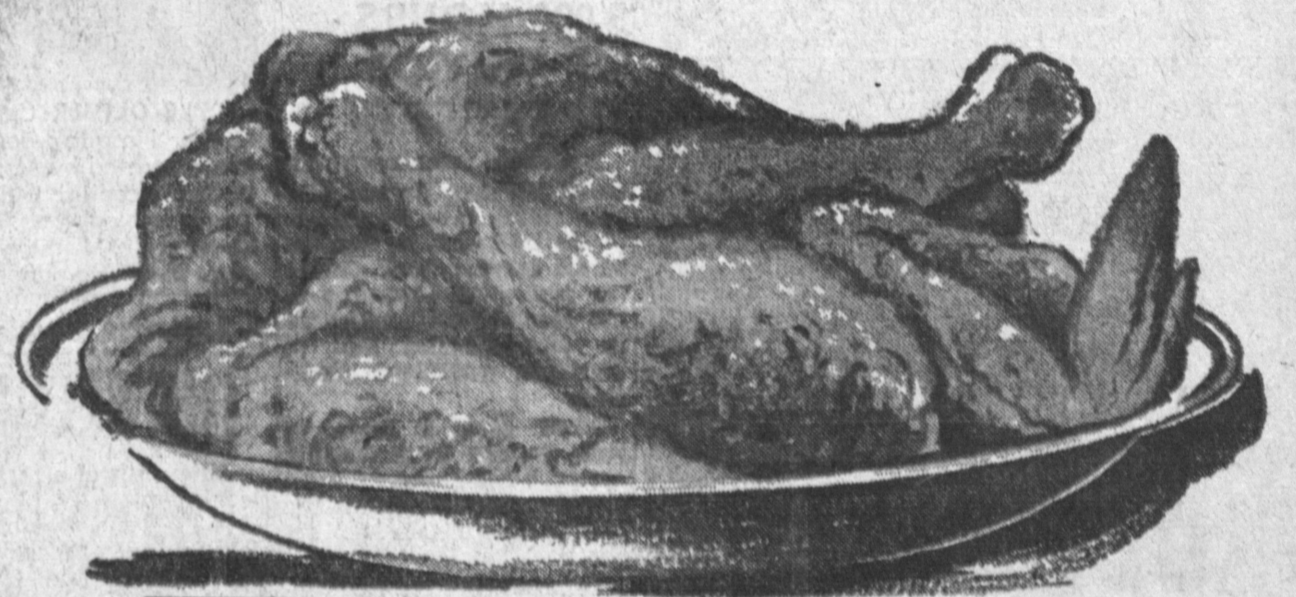
