

Craig Cochran Wins Safety Poster Awar

Parents of Craig Cochran, Lincoln School eighth grader, can well be proud of the most recent of his many accomplishments, this time in the field of art. Several months ago Craig entered the national safety poster contest sponsored by the American Automobile Association, as did some 16,000 other students throughout the United States and Cana-

This was his first artistic endeavor and he was not too hopeful of even receiving an honorable mention. However, the national judges in Washington, D.C. thought otherwise of his work and awarded him the first place in the junior high school division of the contest, which is one of the three divisions in which awards are made annually, the other two being given to a student in the high schools and in the elementary schools.

According to Lincoln School principal Ernest Thom and Craig's teacher, James Latimer, his art work is not his only accomplishment. In the four years he has been at Lincoln Elementary School he has proved himself a scholar by earning excellent grades; he is an outstanding athlete, both in school and as a member of the Torrance Pony League; and his leadership among his fellow classmates is borne out by the fact that they recently elected him president of the Student Council this year.

"Craig Cochran," said Thom. "is what we would consider an All-American boy. We hate to see him leave in June" he continued, 'but our loss will be North High School's gain.'

The entire student body gathered at a special assembly Friday to honor Craig as Ron Field, safety consultant of the Automobile Club of Southern California, representing the national organization, presented him with the award. Also in attendance were his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Howland.
