Something **For Everyone** In the Family

The Torrance Family YM CA announced its most ambitious summer camping schedule in history today. with 20 separate sessions of camp for boys, girls and families.

In addition to the many camps for all ages, the local YMCA is also offering a summer reading institute for boys and girls who will be entering second grade through high school in the Fall. Starting July 1, the self-help program will be conducted three days a week by Robert Metcalf, popular PMCA reading instructor.

Because of the great variety and scope of the program, the local Y has published a four-page newspaper describing the many outings open to all kids during summer months.

For the youngest children, the YMCA has slated a serles of weekend outings in which parents are invited to attend also. The first of these is the Chilao Dad-Son Camp on June 8 and 9, in which fathers and sons camp out under the stars for a two day Indian-style outing. Then, on July 27 and 28, the Y will hold a family beach camp at Newport Dunes near Balboa. Another family weekend camp will be held September 9 and 10 at YM-CA Camp Big Pines, near Jackson Lake. The final weekend outing for Dads and Sons, 6 to 9 years of age, will be held at Camp Little Green Valley on Sept. 21 and 22. The "Y" will operate tra-

ditional mountain camps for boys or girls, 9 to 12 years of age, at Round Meadow, Nitchy Wahoo and Big Pines in early August. These camps are scheduled such that youngsters can attend summer school, and then go on to Y camp afterward.

The biggest portion of the YMCA program is designed for boys and girls of teenage. Starting the day after school is out, there are three amps for older youth. One

is a base camp at Rainbow Falls for girls 12 and older; one is a pack-in base camp at Thousand Island Lake for boys 12 and up; and, the third camp to commence on June 15 is the Shadow Lake Backpack Hike for girls 16 and up. They will hike 26 miles along the famed John Muir Trail, to view lakes, meadows, mountain crags and to try their luck at fishing for golden trout.

Also, in cooperation with the Los Angeles YMCA, there are two special camps offered. One is designed for children who are hard of hearing or deaf, and will be located at YMCA Camp Mozumdar from Aug. 3 to 10. It is also the Viking Long Term Camp for boys 9 to 16 who wish to spend four to eight weeks in the mountains. Special folders can be obtained at the YMCA regarding these camps.

Torrance and Lomita youngsters have already begun selling YMCA peanuts in order to help earn their way to Y Camp, and all boys and girls who wish to do so can obtain their peanuts and business license from the YMCA office. More than 300. youngsters earned their way to Y camp last year.

With the exception of the Long Term and Hard of Hearing Camps, all camps described will be directed and staffed by local professional youth workers from the Torrance YMCA. Volunteer Counselors also attend each session, and training programs for these men and women are now in progress at the Y.
