

Summer School Registration Slated for June 17 at EC

Registration for summer session classes at El Camino College will be conducted for currently enrolled students on June 17 from 1 to 3 and from 5:30 to 7 p.m. Merl F. Sloan, director of student personnel, announced today.

All other students may enroll during the same hours on the following day. Class registration conducted under the supervision of Leo M. Christian, assistant director of student personnel, will be conducted in the Student Activity Building.

Schedule listing classes to be offered in the June 19 to July 31 session as well as those to be given in the August 5 to 30 session are currently available in the college registration office. Information regarding requirements for placement examinations, immunization and veterans' subsistence is included on the schedule.

During the summer session, classes will be offered during both morning and evening hours with a six-unit program considered a fulltime equivalent. Four units of work may be taken in the August session, when all classes will be conducted during morning hours.

Registration for the latter will be held on August 2 from 8:30 a.m. to 9 a.m. for persons whose last names begin with letters A through L and from 10 to 11 a.m. for those from M through Z.

More than 170 classes will be included in the summer session curriculum, with

nearly 40 sections offered during post session.

"Any person planning to enroll in either or both of the summer sessions should remember that these sessions concentrate in a very short period of time the equivalent of a full semester of academic work.

The same credit is awarded for the same work which is accomplished in the number of hours during regular sessions," Christian emphasized, adding that only the period of study is condensed, necessitating a reduced number of units.

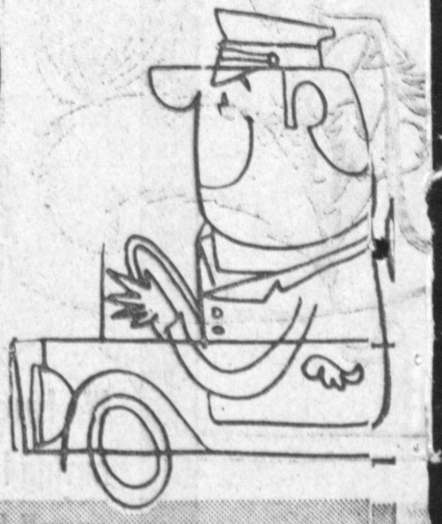
