Centralized Point 'Faced with the tremendous growth resulting from heavy construction, we saw it would be necessary to establish a centralized point to handle all the information requests from Compton to the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

"Until last year, when we put the new Torrance office into operation, we were handling information calls from several offices in the area. Now we can accomplish the same thing with fewer offices and we're not standing pat," Pyle said.


