### Mother of 2 In Critical Condition

The woman, Mrs. Dorothy Lee Metzler, 30, of 3127 W. 177th St., is in critical condition at Harbor General but is expected to live.

She still has a bullet in her head, it was reported. Robert Arthur Ryan, 34, of 2818 182nd St., a mailercontractor, had been dating Mrs. Metzler for several months, police said, since Mrs. Metzler's estrangement

from her husband, Robert F.

PULLED PISTOL Last night, when Ryan came over to see Mrs. Metz-Ier, the mother of two girls, age 9 and 8, told the operator of a mailing service that she was through with him and was going to recon-

cile with her husband. Ryan then pulled a loaded .32 caliber Colt automatic out of his coat, fired one shot at Mrs. Metzler and put one bullet in his own temple, according to what the woman was able to tell

Mrs. Metzler's two horrified daughters came into the living room, scene of the shooting, as Ryan lay on the floor, and Mrs. Metzler mustered enough strength to call her estranged hus

Metzler called Gardena police, who summoned the

Torrance officers. RUSHED TO HOSPITAL

Police put the time of the shooting at about 9:30 p.m. The husband arranged to take care of the two girls, while Mrs. Metzler and the dying Ryan were rushed to Harbor General Hospital.

The shot Ryan fired at Mrs. Metzler apparently struck just above her eye. then grazed her skull, police

NO PREVIOUS THREATS Metzler told police he had not known of his wife's intention to reconcile with him, but said he had been hoping for that to happen.

He said he had been talking to his wife in recent days and that things were 'getting better" for them. The grief-stricken husband said he didn't know of any previous threats or violence by Ryan. His wife, he said, 'wouldn't have stood for
