

3 South Bay Pools Begin Operations

Three South Bay High School District pools operated by the County of Los Angeles Department of Parks and Recreation have begun their summer schedules with free swimming for young people under 18 years of age, last Saturday, announced Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Aviation, Mira Costa and Redondo High School's pools will schedule public swimming daily, from 1 to 3 p.m., and 3:30 to 5:30 p.m.

Evening pool schedules are as follows: Aviation, 2025 Manhattan Beach Blvd., Tuesdays and Thursdays; Mira Costa, 701 S. Peck Avenue, Mondays and Wednesdays; and Redondo, Tuesdays and Fridays. The pools are open from 6 to 9 p.m.

Admission to South Bay pools is 25 cents for teenagers under 18 years, and 50 cents for adults. Children under 7 years of age are admitted only when accompanied by adults.

Swimming lessons will be offered at all pools, daily, from 9:30 a.m. until 12 noon. Free swimming is conducted Saturdays for young people under 18 years.
