

Graphic Art Collection Is On Display

The June show at the Library Gallery, 2400 Via Campesina, Palos Verdes Estates, is "T heSulwick Collection of International Graphic Art" - a group of more than 50 lithographs, etchings and linoleum cuts from the collection of Joseph Sulwick, of Los Angeles.

Sulwick, who travels extensively in Europe, is a foreign patent attorney with Hughes Aircraft Co., and is and vaid collector of prints. In his words, he was attracted to graphic art because it retains the artist's expression, contrasted to reproductions, and yet could be purchased at an average price, in contrast to oil paintings.
