A 59-year-old Negro man was found shot and near death late yesterday in a field just outside the Torrance city limits.

The victim, Chauncev S. Mitchell, was rushed to Little Company of Mary Hos-10c A COPY pital, where doctors battled for his life all night. He was unconscious from the time he was discovered and little chance was given for his survival.

Mitchell was discovered about 5:30 p.m. by a laborer on his way home who cut across a path in the field just north of Sepulveda Boulevard and four blocks west of Palos Verdes Boule-
