

HONORS LIST GROWS AT EL CAMINO

Although campus recognition of outstanding academic achievement was climaxed in June, El Camino College honors lists continue to grow.

Records of El Camino transfers who have continued their work at the University of California at Los Angeles indicate that 13 alumni have distinguished themselves on the Westwood campus.

Vern W. Robinson, associate director of relations with schools, notified Dr. Stuart E. Masee, president of El Camino College, of the distinctions recently.

Mrs. Lia Anderson, who

entered UCLA in the fall of 1960, graduated with highest honors in the college of letters and science this spring. A German major, Mrs. Anderson was elected to membership in the national scholastic honors group, Phi Beta Kappa. She was named to the dean's honor list at UCLA on three occasions.

Also elected to Phi Beta Kappa was Michael Letterello, who also entered UCLA in the fall of 1960.

A physical education major, Robert S. Hutton, was graduated with honors from the College of Letters and Science this spring. Mini-

mum requirement for this distinction is a grade point average of 3.0. Hutton entered UCLA in the fall of 1961.

Donald S. Brown, another fall, 1961, entrant, was named to the dean's honor list in the College of Letters and Science in the fall of 1962. Twelve units of A and not more than three units of B work are required for the distinction. Brown, a resident of Torrance, is an anthropology major.

Another resident of Torrance, Ralph Vroman, entered UCLA in the fall of 1961, and was cited as an honors student in the School of Business Administration this spring.

Senior honors in the School of Business Administration were awarded to three additional alumni of El Camino College. They are James M. Baker, Tryon N. Sisson and Leland G. Stephens.

Highest honors achieved by 1963 graduates with bachelor of science degrees in the College of Engineering went this year to Frank Kenneth Rickman, whose grade point average was above 3.8. Rickman was also the winner of top science recognition at ECC.

Three additional El Camino College engineering alumni graduated from the college of engineering with honors this spring. Tabulating grade point averages ranging from 3.25 to 3.7 were Donald R. Eakin, James G. Lee and Kenji Kobayashi.

A fourth engineering major, Ronald Bernhard was elected to Tau Beta Pi, honorary fraternity whose membership is open to students majoring in engineering.

Bro. John McNeil Studies at Berkeley

Brother John A. McNeil, S.M., son of Mrs. Bertha F. McNeil and the late John A. Hedberg, of Torrance, was accepted for post-graduate work for teachers this summer at the University of California at Berkeley. He is working on his master's degree in science. Bro. Flamencos Feature Fete At College

A summer forum program combining flamenco guitarists and a jazz musician, will give Harbor College students a break from their summer studies Thursday in the Harbor College gymnasium at 8:30 p.m.

The flamenco music will

be provided by James Fawcett and Martin Walker. Billed as "Dos Flamencos," the two artists have the distinction of being the first American guitar duo ever to master the extremely difficult medium.

Both men, while visiting Spain, became interested in the music of the Spanish gypsies and returned to study and perform in Spain. While there they combined their soulful melodies to the light, care free tunes of the flamenco idiom.

Curtis Amy, a 33-year-old tenor saxophone artist from

Houston, has recorded four albums of West Coast Jazz in the past two years. He plays with an open, vital style combining the spirit of earlier jazz musicians with the more restrained expression of contemporary artists.

Amy performed with the Melba Liston quintet, Dizzy Gillespie, the Perri Lee trio and the Luis Riveria trio before striking out on his own.

Larry Napier Completes Army Training Course

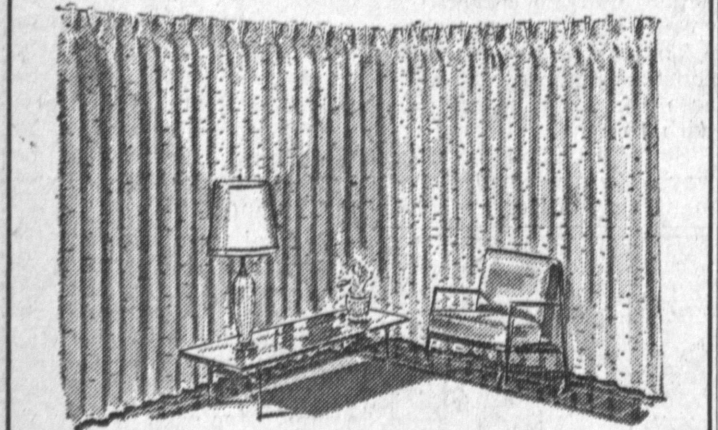
