

Lutherans to Install New Associate Pastor

First Lutheran Church, corner Carson and Flower in Torrance, will install Rev. Phillip C. Hiller as associate pastor at the 10:45 worship service Sunday. The present pastor, William J. Roleder, will serve as liturgist for the service.

Dr. Walter Hellman, executive vice president of the South Pacific District, will

preach the sermon and install Pastor Hiller. Rev. Hiller will serve primarily in the field of education, assuming the administration of the congregation's elementary school and directing the Sunday Church School program. He will begin his work immediately at First Lutheran.

The new pastor has de-

voted the major portion of his adult years equally between the gospel ministry and education, public and religious.

Born at New Hope, Wisc., Rev. Hiller completed his college work at St. Olaf with an A.B. degree. He earned his M.A. degree at the University of Wisconsin and his theological degree from Luther Theological Seminary, St. Paul, Minn. Further graduate work was pursued at Princeton Theological Seminary.

He began his teaching career at Slayton, Minn., served as supervising principal at Roshon, Wis., and taught for a time at Luther College, Decorah, Iowa. For the past two years he was principal at Trinity Lutheran School in Hawthorne.

For four years he edited the "Lutheran Teacher," a monthly educational magazine. He has also authored several instructional materials. Pastors have been held at Peterson and Mabel, Minn., and at Madison and Milwaukee, Wis.

Rev. Hiller is married to the former Arnelia Burnett. Mrs. Hiller received an A.B. degree from St. Olaf College and continued graduate work at the University of Minnesota. She has served several years as teacher and principal in the public schools in Minnesota. Their son, David, graduated from Hawthorne High School this past spring and will enter California Lutheran Bible School this fall. Their daughter, Arlene, will return to St. Olaf this fall as a senior. Both children graduated from Lutheran elementary schools. The Hillers have their home in Hawthorne. Rev. Hiller will continue as kindergarten teacher at Trinity Lutheran.

Well-Known Cantor To Sing at Holidays

"Dr. Harold Stein, well-known Southern California cantor, has been engaged to chant High Holy Service for Congregation Ner Tamid, conservative congregation.

Cantor Stein, who has a richly-colored baritone voice, first began his cantorial career at the early age of 15. He was a protegee of the famous Cantor Roman Cysowski of San Francisco. His cantorial background also includes studies at the School of Sacred Music with Max Helfman, one of the leading Jewish musicologists in this country.

During World War II, while serving in the U.S. Air Force, Dr. Stein acted as cantor. Over the years he has conducted services at many synagogues throughout California and Oregon. For the past five years, he has served Southwest Temple Beth Torah of Gardena as cantor.

Dr. Stein is also an established optometrist with offices in Long Beach. He at-

tended both UCLA and the University of California at Berkeley.

Prior to entering private practice, he was a member of the faculty at the Los Angeles College of Optometry. As a native son, Dr. Stein proudly points to his grandfather as one of the early Jewish pioneers in Los Angeles.

The educational program accommodates children from kindergarten through confirmation. The Hebrew School holds week-day as well as Sunday sessions, the total program being under the supervision of Rabbi Bernard Wechsberg.

Translations Open Interest in Bible

A local Bible student and lecturer said today the Bible is a book that was written to be understood.

Berger Holm, ministry school instructor of the Torrance Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses, said modern translation of the Holy Scriptures are creating a new interest in the Bible and opening the way for many people to better understand the practical wisdom the Bible contains. He feels that many have difficulty in reading archaic expressions.

"If a reader is interested in history, poetry, philosophy, science, travel or wise sayings," Holm said, "he will enjoy reading the Bible. If you enjoy heroic tales of adventure, romance, or even a glimpse into the future, you'll find the Bible fascinating reading."

Holm said the original Bible languages of Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek, were the languages of the common people at the time the Bible was composed, but these have long since passed from the scene.

"It is the purpose of its Author that all people should be able to read the Bible," he continued. "The principal reason behind providing modern translations is to give the public a translation of God's Word that accurately expressed the fine shades of meaning contained in the original language of the Bible manuscripts, and and is, at the same time, understandable to the average person."

Holm concluded by saying the Bible is a Divine Library that can be carried in one hand. He made it plain that he defends modern translations, designed to be read and understood.
