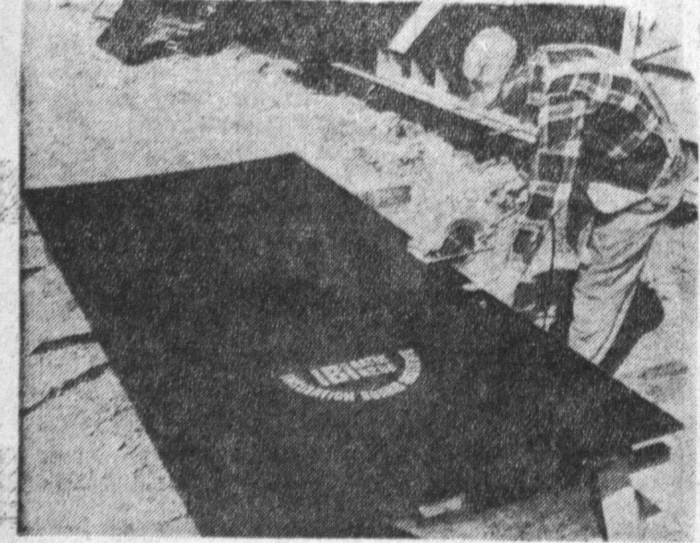

### Popular Dining Spot Has Mountain Location

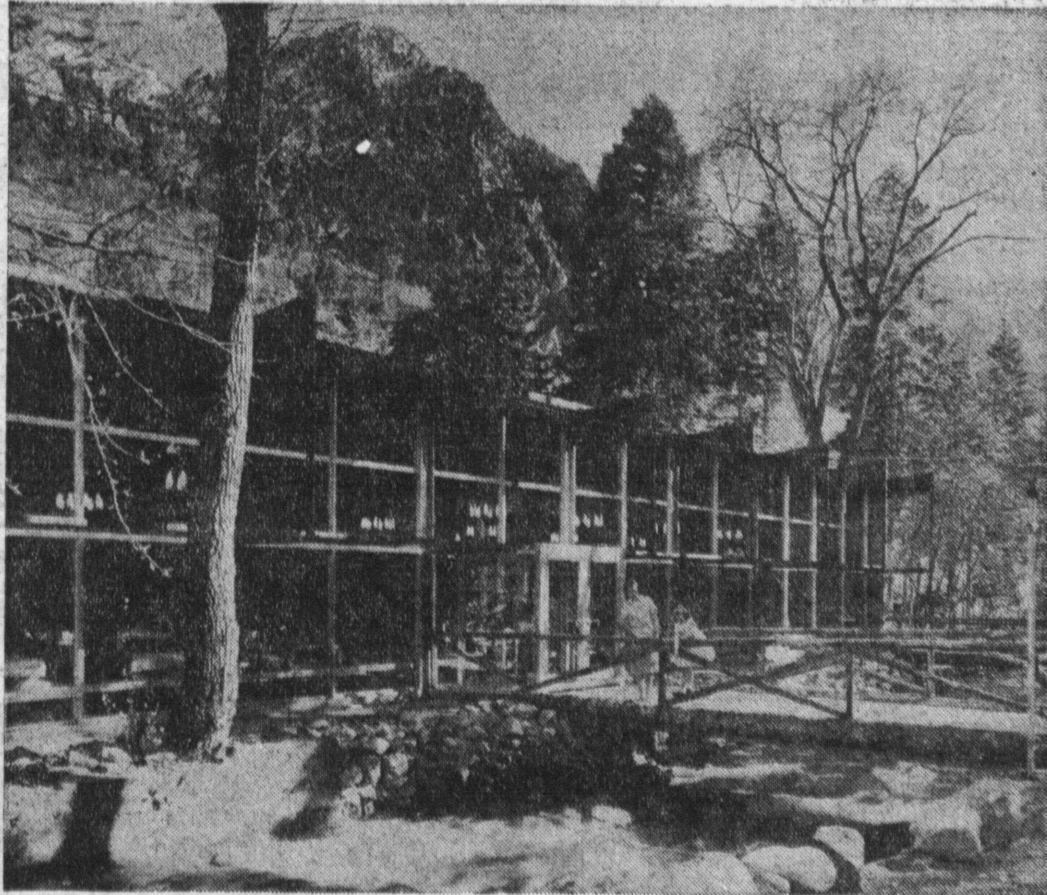

UP BIG COTTONWOOD CANYON in Utah, a crystal mountain creek pushes lazily down the canyon. That's the setting for Maxfield Lodge, popular dining spot of the Salt Lake City area. Big view windows glazed with Thermopane insulating glass line the entire elevation overlooking the creek, lending an assist to capturing the open world atmosphere created by the rugged mountain location. Inside, diners look out onto the stream and upward at the rocky slopes as they climb heavenward above the floor of the canyon. Maxfield Lodge is at Brighton, Utah, 18 miles southeast of Salt Lake City. Architects were Lamole & Nicholatis, of Salt Lake City.

### All About Dogs

#### Holiday Fun

When kids take a holiday, they're not the only ones who are enjoying themselves. For the canine member of the family, school holidays are special occasions too. They're the special times when a dog and his young master have lots more time to play together.

Romps in the country and games with groups of boys are great fun for a dog. Some bright pooches have turned out to be great outfielders when baseball is played with a rubber ball soft enough to be held between a dog's teeth. Most dogs love to retrieve a ball, stick or almost anything thrown for them to chase after.

"Go Fetch" is a summer game any boy can teach his dog, advises Clarence C. Fawcett, an authority on dog training at the Purina Dog Care Center in St. Louis, Missouri.

### NEW YORK, N.Y. (CFN) - Despite 18 years of water fluoridation and more than 8,000 published scientific reports proving that it safely reduces tooth decay, most U.S. communities still do not fluoridate their water.



Fluoride is a natural chemical often found in soil, food and water. When taken regularly in small amounts, it has the ability to harden tooth enamel, making children's teeth more resistant to decay.

In addition to favorable scientific evidence, the concept of fluoridation of public water supplies has the endorsement of leading professional and governmental agencies: the American Dental Association; the American Medical Association; the American Association for the Advancement of Science;

the U.S. Public Health Service, and the World Health Organization.

Until recently, children in nonfluoridated areas were unable to get enough fluoride in their diet to have any great effect on reducing the number of cavities. To fill this need pharmaceutical science has developed an effective fluoride supplement formula known as Vi-Daylin w/Fluoride.

Vi-Daylin w/Fluoride is a chewable candy-like tablet that not only contains fluoride but also all the vitamins that children normally need.

Dental authorities say, however, that a vitamin-fluoride supplement is only one step in a proper cavity-reduction program. The following three steps should be taken also:

Have children brush teeth regularly and thoroughly three times a day, if possible.

Schedule and keep regular medical and dental appointments. Control the amount of sweets and sugar your children eat, and avoid between-meal treats.
