GOLF ACTIVITIES FOR VARIED GROUPS SLATED

The Torrance recreation department announces continuing golf instruction and activities at several of its parks and playgrounds during the summer season.

Adult Golf Instruction
At the Sea-Aire golf course a wide variety of programs are in progress. Adult instruction is offered in Monday-Wednesday and Tuesday-Thursday classes, each meeting in 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. divisions on those days.

The classes meet for three weeks or six times each. Classes are open to both men and women beginners and are restricted to ten members. Fee is \$3.75 for six lessons.

Women's Golf Club
The Sea-Aire Women's Golf Club meets on Thursdays from 9 a. m. until noon, when baby-sitting, provided by the club at a small fee for each child, enables members to enjoy morning rounds of golf on the park's 9-hole course. Periodic tournaments and other special events are scheduled. Membership in the club costs \$1 per year.

Youth Golf Sponsored
The departments also offers a wide program of youth golf activities. At several of the parks and at the Lincoln and Hillside school playgrounds, frequent sessions of golf instruction will continue for boys and girls of 9-17 years. Under the tutelage of Jay Lowry, instructor covers the rules and fundamental skills of golf. No fee is charged and golf clubs and practice balls are provided for the lessons. At beginning of each session, the total group meets at 2 p. m. on Monday for introduction and preliminary instruction.

At that time classes are grouped according to ages and then meet on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at 2, 3 or 4 p.m. for 45-minute lessons.

The youth golf program also includes field trips to the Sea-Aire course, where members of the class involved play the course under the guidance of their instructor. The 50-cent fee for the trip provides bus fare with trip insurance, a round of golf at the course and use of golf clubs.

On Aug. 22 and 23 the youth golf program will sponsor a novice tournament.

Teen-Age Golf Club
Sea-Aire also plays host to its own Teen-Age Golf Club, whose special activities are being held Thursday afternoons at the course with the annual tournament scheduled for Aug. 26 and 27. The club accepts members

of 9 years through high school graduation, with a fee of 50 cents a year.
