Randy, of 2340 230th St., is only 18 months old. but he's already had an experience many adults have missed and they're glad of it.

Only alert action by Randy's mother, the Torrance police and fire departments, and Little Company of Mary Hospital saved the boy's life.

Randy's mother. Myrna, had been cleaning porcelain in the family bathroom and had left some turpentine in a paper cup, she told police. Randy came into the room, discovered the cup, and quaffed heartily.

After drinking the fluid, Randy stopped breathing and turned blue, his mother said.

She called police, who rushed the child to the hospital. On the way they met a fire department rescue unit and transfered the oxygen unit to the police car to assist the child's breathing the rest of the way to the

At Little Company of Mary, doctors took charge in the emergency ward, removed the turpentine and restored Randy's breathing. He was reported in good condition to-

day, and was expected to go home today. He's eating and drinking merrily, hospital attendants said, but turpentine's not
