What Price Religion?

A layman has stated that "practiced religion, including specifically Christianity, has been more or less directly responsible for everything bad that has happened to man in the past 2,000 years."

The layman will be answered later by a theologian and The Sounding Board will fit the two voices into a dialogue for those who may be interested.

Of immediate concern today is the statement of the layman that "Abraham Lincoln probably was not a Christian. His own law partner said he was an infi-

Mr. Lincoln faced allegations of this sort with some concern while he was alive and it seems that the passage of nearly a hundred years since his death has not stilled those voices.

On August 11, 1846, 117 years ago last Sunday, Mr. Lincoln took note of one of the contemporary voices, that of a minister who was running against Mr. Lincoln for Congress.

I Have Never Denied Truth

"A charge having got into circulation in some of the neighborhoods of this district, in substance that I am an open scoffer at Christianity. I have by the advice of some friends concluded to notice the subject in this form," wrote Mr. Lincoln to a newspaper.

That I am not a member of any Christian Church, is true; but I have never denied the truth of the Scriptures; and I have never spoken with intentional disrespect of religion in general, or of any denomination of Christians in particular.

"It is true that in early life," continued Mr. Lincoln, "I was inclined to believe in what I understand is called the 'Doctrine of Necessity' - that is, that the human mind is compelled to action, or held in rest by some power, over which the mind itself has no control; and I have sometimes (with one, two, or three, but never publicly) tried to maintain this opinion in argument, - the habit of arguing thus however, I have entirely left for more than five years and I add here, I have always understood this same opinion to be held by several of the Christian denomi-

"The foregoing is the whole truth, briefly stated, in relation to myself, upon the subject.

"I do not think I could myself, be brought to support a man for office, whom I knew to be an open enemy of, and scoffer at, religion.

"Leaving the higher matter of eternal conse-" quences between him and his Maker, I still do not think any man has the right thus to insult the feelings, and injure the morals, of the community in which he may live.

"If, then, I was guilty of such conduct, I should blame no man who should condemn me for it," Mr. Lincoln concluded, "but I do blame those, whoever they may be, who falsely put such a charge in circulation against me."

Assistance of a Divinity

Nearly fifteen years later, when leaving his friends and home on February 11, 1961, to depart for Washington, D.C., and the Presidency, Mr. Lincoln spoke briefly on the subject of a Divine Being.

'I now leave not knowing when, or whether I may return, with a task before me greater than that which rested upon Washington," said Mr. Lincoln.

"Without the assistance of that Divine Being Who ever attended him, I cannot succeed. With that as-

sistance, I cannot fail. "Trusting in Him, Who can go with me, and remain with you and be everywhere for good, let us

confidently hope that all will yet be well. "To His care commending you, as I hope in your prayers you will recommend me, I bid you an affectionate farewell," said Mr. Lincoln.

The Mind of an Infidel?

It seems that the mind which could phrase those words in reference to a Divine Being was not the mind of an infidel.

Despite the warm and enduring affection which existed between Mr. Lincoln and Billy Herndon his law partner, Mr. Lincoln is a far better interpreter of his own mind than Herndon.

Mr. Lincoln recognized the fact that without our religions - whatever they may be - we human beings could not be able to tell the difference between what is good and what is bad.


