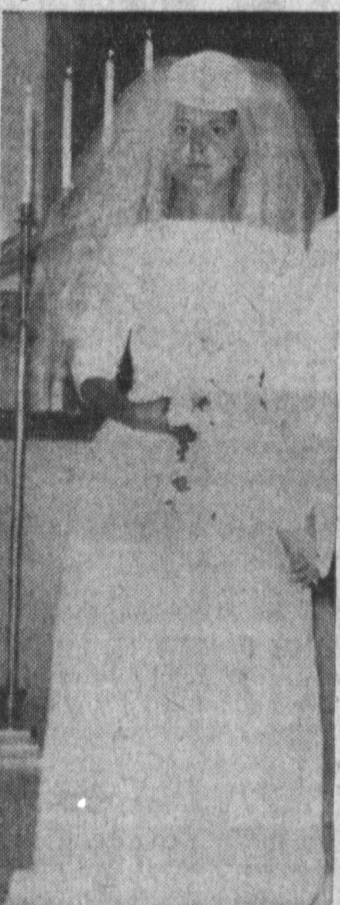

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Nursery School Registration Open

Bruce Saffery, president of the Torrance Cooperative Nursery School, has announced opening are available for September registration of pre-schoolers. Children under Kindergarten age, who will be three years old by the opening of school in the fall are eligible.

The school is in operation from 9 until 11:30 a.m. four mornings per week during the school year. The morning session is a laboratory experience for mothers who participate once each week as assistants under the guidance of Mrs. Alvin Kaye, teacher-director.

Mothers learn to work with children in a well-rounded nursery school program which includes outdoor equipment in a large fenced yard. A modern nursery school building also houses many recreational and educational materials. Fathers and mothers attend evening classes where a varied program of films, discussion groups and lectures by experts in child-study offer a better understanding of their children and themselves. Fathers spend there hours per month engaged in the construction and repair of school equipment.

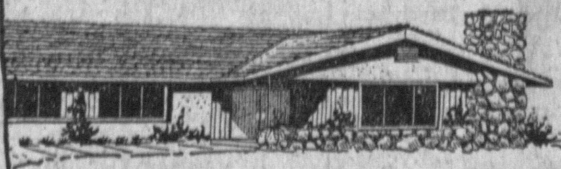
Summer playground will close Aug. 30. It will be open for the fall season from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. starting Sept. 17, 1963.
