Terry had other talents too, as she worked as a dancer with Franco and Marco and the famous Veloz and Yolanda engaged her services. She also played bit parts in several movies. Oil painting was her hobby.

Mrs. Wilcox was an extraordinary person, as I learned on the afternoon prior to her death, when I took my wife to see her for the last time. Terry herself knew the end was near, having been administered by her priest and physician and having regained consciousness from a coma, she could now recognize her family. Her husband was at her side trying to comfort her, and barely able to speak, Terry was concerned about her husband having his lunch that day. This is the type person she was, always thinking of others.

Terry Carmen Wilcox, who resided at 500 Paseo de las Estrellas in Torrance, is survived by her husband Raymond; a son, Joseph; four brothers, Carl, Louis, Alfonso and Mario Cordero, all of Los Angeles, and two sisters, Isabel Yruretagoyena of Anaheim and Mrs. Josephine Villanueva of Los Angeles. She will be sadly missed and also be remembered by hundreds of admirers in the South Bay area.

Kingston Trio at Greek Theater

Henry Mancini, popular composer - conductor who joins forces with The Kingston Trio at the Greek Theater September 9 through the 15, is the epitome of Hollywood stardom! With a classical background of Julliard School of Music and private studies with Ernst Krenek, Mario Castelnuovo - Tedesco and Dr. Alfred Sendry, he moved through the movie realm of lim scores to top ranking composer in a relatively short period of ten years.

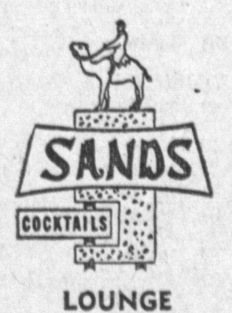
