# Camino Coach Is Optimistic For 63 Season

An optimistic Ken Swearinggen welcomed a cast of 14 returning lettermen and 76 newcomers as El Camino College opened its 1963 football session, Sept. 2.

Although an encore of the 1962 performance might prove difficult, the Warriors' coaching staff anticipates a season approaching, and perhaps surpassing, last year's.

The '62 edition won seven games, dropped two, and was ranked sixth in the nation by the All-American JC Grid Index.

El Camino's only losses were to number-one ranked Long Beach and Bakersfield. rated second in the nation.

"I guess that made us the third top team in the country, didn't it?" Swearingen queried.

Assisting Swearingen—in his second season as Warrior coach-will be veteran Don Jurk, who handles ends. and sophomore coaches Bill Vincent, linemen, and Vince McCullough, backs.

Swearingen is a graduate of the University of the Pacific, attending El Camino before entering the Northern California school. He earned All-Metropolitan Conference honors while at El Camino and later won Little All-American mention from UOP. He was a half-

Sweringen was appointed head coach in the spring of 1952, succeeding interim coach Doug Essick, who was handed the head post following the death of Norm Verry during the 1961 season.

#### ASSISTANT COACH

Jurk, "Big Brother" of the coaching staff, has seven years' experience with El Camino gridmen. He also coaches gymnastics, a sport he personally initiated at El Camino in 1956.

The end coach is a graduate of El Camino and San Diego State colleges. He roomed in San Diego with the current Warrior line coach, Vincent.

McCullough, known as "The Little Tiger" to his coaching compatriots, is the only non-Camino graduate on the staff. He attended Occidental College and was an outstanding quarterback during his four-year tenure.

Before joining the Warrior physical education department in 1962, McCullough was head coach for the Redondo High School Seahawks

Vincent is in his second year at El Camino following a successful career at Aviation High, where he was line coach.


