During their training period recruits receive tests and interviews which determine their future assignments in the Navy. Upon completing the program they are assigned to service schools for technical instruction or to ships or shore stations for on-the-job training in a Navy rating specialty.

Naval training produces the power behind seapower by supplying trained and qualified personnel to man the ships, aircraft and shore stations of today's Navy.

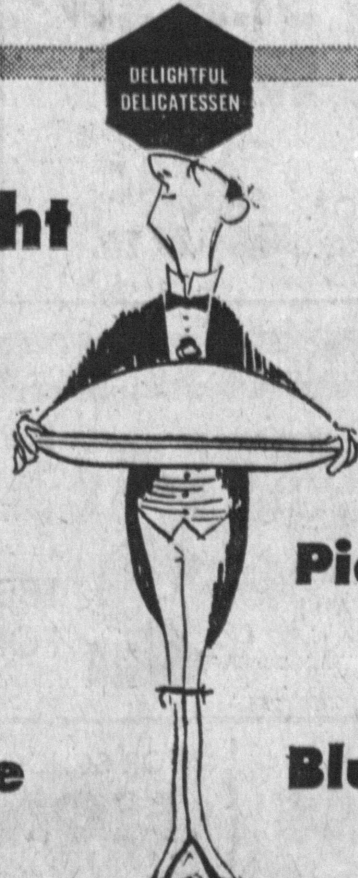

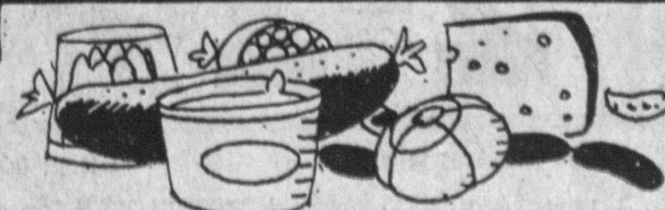
