
A Los Angeles pilot crash landed his small plane in a Lomita parking lot Wednes-day night and walked away from the demolished aircraft with cuts, bruises and a possible broken jaw.

Witness to the crash, a California Highway, Patrol officer, reported he was walking across the parking lot of the Hot'n Tot Restraurant when he observed an airplane gliding toward him at approximately 25 feet off the ground.

When the plane was directly over the lot it stalled and fell to the ground crashing into a parked car.

The pilot Gerald D. Stewart, 43, was able to climb out of the cockpit by himself and was immediately given first aid by the police officer. Stewart told investigating officers he had been flying over the harbor area when he ran out of gas and attempted to reach Torrance

airport by gliding. The victim was transpor-






