Great Moments of Faith By RED LOCKWOOD

There are many paradoxes in human life, there are many mysteries which by their nature cannot ever be understood or solved by human beings,

One is the fact that surrender to a Power higher than one's self brings strength to a human being and with that surrender in the spirit of "Thy will be done," miracles are wrought which cannot ever be explained.

An inner faith in a moment of terrible crisis reflects an outer glow which even savages recognize and respect as an unexplained sign of the greatness of a human soul.

Such a faith endows a human being fortunate enough to find it with the strength to survive ordeals and to surmount adversities which are beyound the power of human strength alone.

Such a faith came to Mary Rowlandson on the 10th of February, 1675, when her village of Lancaster (Mass.) was destroyed by Indians.

Her narrative is much too horrible by today's standards to repeat in detail, it is enough to relate generally what happened to Mrs. Rowlandson.

SHE SURRENDERS

She survived simply because she surrendered her destiny to a Power higher than herself, a great act of faith which in turn produced a great reservoir of strength.

The moment came when Mary Rowlandson was trapped between roaring flames which were devouring her home and howling savages who waited outside the door.

Almost as soon as she emerged, a bullet passed through her side and through the body and the hand of the child she was carrying.

Others ran blindly in fear, they knew not where, and were slain. A man begged frantically and offered money in exchange for his life but the Indians merely laughed at his pleas while they bashed his head to a pulp.

Mary Rowlandson stood with her child in her arms and faced the Indians calm and serene - incarnate Madanna and Child - though her body was wracked by a painful wound and her mind was in torment from the sights of a massacte raging about her.

"The Lord hereby would make us the more to acknowledge His hand," was the way she later phrased the faith which possessed her, "and to see that our help is always in Him."




