Great Moments of Faith By RED LOCKWOOD

Eleven years ago, in August of 1952, a telephone rang in the office of the late newspaper, The Mirror of Los Angeles, to send a newspaperman on the most unforgettable experience of his life.

In addition to reading copy for The Mirror, this newspaperman was the West Coast correspondent of The Toronto Star in Canada.

Shortly before, it had been announced from Australia that Sister Elizabeth Kenny was suffering from Parkinson's disease and that it was to be her last

The news report also said that Sister Kenny was departing by air for the United States on what probably would be her last trip to this country.

She had arrived in Los Angeles he morning of the day that the telephone rang. 'Sister Kenny's in L.A.," said the brusque voice of the editor in far-off Toronto. "She's going to die.

writer sat while a cold dread filled his heart. Then, he dialed Rosalind Russell, who played the part of Sister Kenny in the film and who became

a warm friend of the woman she had portrayed. Sister Kenny usually visited Miss Russell before going to the small cottage which was kept for her use on the grounds of the hospital in El Monte which

An appointment was arranged to meet Sister

Kenny the next night - August 19, 1952. The newspaperman was met graciously at the door by the companion of Sister Kenny and was made comfortably physically if not mentally in a chair in the cozy little cottage.

Soon, Elizabeth Kenny shuffled into the room, her companion by her side, to take a chair opposite that of the writer,

She wore a kimono, her bare ankles showing above the tops of comfortable old slippers. Her thinning hair was starkly white. Her reddened face bore the ravages of time. One hand fluttered like a stricken bird with the tell-tale palsy of Parkinson's disease and was held steady by the affectionate clasp of the

When they were young, those hands had sturdily massaged the limbs and bodies of children ravaged long before their time by the crippling blight of polio. Sister Kenny sat in her chair and looked upon the reporter, waiting for him to ask the question that

he didn't want to ask. Shame and dread cut deeply into his inner conscience. Yet, there was no reproach in the eyes of Sister Kenny as there probably was none when she faced those who had opposed her ideas earlier in life. As though to escape, the writer asked her other

As she spoke, the mind began to fill with wonder at the tremendous contribution which one human being who has faith in the goodness of life can make

to the lives of others. And slowly the newspaperman lost himself in the glory of the rare privilege of being in the presence of a great human soul.

As a child he often had wondered what the great figures of our history really were like, and that night he knew: They took with humility and gratitude the precious gift of life, endowed it with faith, and then dedicated it completely with love to humanity.

Gradually, dread left his heart and shame followed as he asked the question almost exactly as it had been

phrased by the editor in Toronto: "Sister Kenny, it is said that you are about to die. What do you think of the hereafter?"

The body tensed for a fleeting flash, then relaxed under the control of the spirit. A warm glow entered

'Why," said Sister Elizabeth Kenny on the night of August 19, 1952, "I think I will find it as I have found life to be - a glorious adventure."
