

THINGS TO SEE IN SOUTHLAND

The 54th Annual Julian Apple Days and the 26th Annual Arroyo Grande Gay 90's Harvest Festival top the list of things to see in the Southland this week. Here is the schedule of activities in the area for the period of Sept. 26 through Oct. 5 as compiled by the Automobile Club of Southern California.

HARVEST FESTIVAL
The 26th Annual Arroyo Grande Gay 90's Harvest Festival will be held Oct. 3, 4, and 5. This year's theme will be "Harvest Moon Memories." Festivities will include a "Belle of the Festival" contest, parade, flower and art show, hobby show, produce displays, dances, football game, carnival booths, rides and a variety of entertainment. Stores will be decorated with mementoes of the Gay 90's era, and residents traditionally wear Gay 90's costumes.

KERN COUNTY FAIR
The 40th Annual Kern County Fair is a "Salute to King Cotton," and will be held through Sept. 29. Areas of the fairgrounds at Bakersfield have been planted to cotton and at fair time the bolls will be sprayed various colors. There will be a cotton fashion show, and a leather fashion show. Also included in the Fair will be the Great Kern Aquacade, a free Horse Show, a Circus, a championship Rodeo, and a livestock show.

STAGE COACH DAYS
Stage Coach Days will be held Oct. 2 through 5, with a big parade on the last day.

FIESTA LA BALLONA
Fiesta La Ballona will be held Oct. 2 through 5 in Culver City.

CAR RACES
Car Races — MG's will be held Sept. 28 and 29 at the Del Mar Fairgrounds, parking lot. The Sports Car Club of America will feature divisional championship races. Trails begin at 9 a.m. and races begin at 11 a.m. on both days.

RAISIN FESTIVAL
The National Raisin Festival will be held Sept. 28 and 29 on Mountain View Avenue, halfway between U.S. 9 and Dinuba. Delicious raisin foods, a big Raisin Parade, sports car competition, vintage airplanes, an art show, special events for children and an automobile show will be featured at this event.

APPLE DAYS
The 54th Annual Julian Apple Days will be held Oct. 5 and 6. Events for this year's celebration include: the apple harvest with dancing, melodramas, western parade on Oct. 6, and other special events which create a western pioneer atmosphere in this old Gold mining town.

LOS ANGELES
The L. A. Dodgers will play Philadelphia Sept. 27 and 28 at 8 p.m., and Sept. 29 at 1 p.m. in Dodger Stadium.

USC will play Oklahoma at 1:30 p.m. Sept. 28, and Michigan State Oct. 4 at 8 p.m. in the Coliseum.

The Los Angeles County Museum will feature Fossil Freshwater Fish of Western America through Nov. 3. An exhibition of fossil fish from the Green River Formation, selected mainly from the

prize collection of Robert L. Lynch, will be presented by the Vertebrate Paleontology Section of the Earth Sciences Division.

Featured at the same time in the museum will be an exhibit of plant specimens selected from the award-winning collection of Mr. George Schrader.

George Schrader. The Schrader collection, made in 1880, was exhibited 80 years ago.

Masterworks of Mexican Art will be featured in the museum Oct. 2 through Jan. 1964. This is the largest and most comprehensive exhibition ever organized of the history of Mexican art covering over 3,000 years and objects. For the last two years, the exhibition has toured most of the major capitals of Europe. Chamber music is provided each Sunday at 3 p.m. in the museum.

MARATHON, CARNIVAL, FAIR
The Needles Marathon will be held Sept. 28 and 29. A 100-mile boat race will take place.

The First Annual Summer Carnival in Pico-Rivera will be held at Streamland Picnic Park, Sept. 29 from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Activities for this event are: carnival games, kiddie rides, dance contests, inter-club sports, introduction of Snow Queen Contestants, full course meal, free coffee all day, and free Dryland Ski School.

The Los Angeles County Fair will be held through Sept. 29. This year's fair adds an authentic Storkbook Farm—a full scale model of an actual farmhouse, complete with Far Wife cooking on a wood stove, hand pumping water, ironing with a sadiron. In a "Cuddle Corral," children can pet baby sheep, goats, chickens, rabbits, burro and pony. They crawl through a tree house and exit through a slide. Grandstand shows include Janet Blair, Polack Bros. Circus, and 80-piece USAF band.

FIESTA
Fishermen's Fiesta will be held at the Port of Los Angeles in San Pedro, Sept. 27 through 29. The fiesta offers a memorable weekend with beautifully decorated fishing boats, folk dancers in native costume, fishermen (descendants of Old World fishermen of six nations) competing in the fascinating skills of their trade. The boat parade, commanded by the lovely "Skipperette" and her "Mates," international food booths, games of skill, and gay rides.

FAIRS, FESTIVALS
The Twenty-nine Palms Country Fair will be held Sept. 27 and 28. The "Northernmost Daisies in America" celebrates, for the second year, with a baby parade, games such as raw egg pitching, and crowning of a queen.

St. Andrew's Priory Fall Festival will be held Sept. 28 and 29. The annual two-day Fall Festival features excellent art works in several media, a stage play on both evenings and many other activities. Food will be served on both days.

The Ventura County Fair will be held Oct. 2 through 6. There will be a full breed horse show during fair time.

Publishing Assessments Studied by Kenneth Hahn

A report on the merits of using newspapers to notify taxpayers of their property assessments is in progress by order of Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Hahn said publishing the property assessments, listed by street names and addresses, in community newspapers, would give the taxpayer a chance to see that his assessment is equal with that of his neighbors.

"The public should have full information on property assessments to make sure they are fair and just," Hahn said.

"I can think of no better way to inform the homeowner of his assessment than through newspapers, with the property being listed by street number and address and not by tract number," he added.

He pointed out listing by street address would avoid confusion and give every resident the opportunity to see that his property was assessed fairly in comparison to his neighbors.

New State law makes it mandatory that county assessors notify property owners by mail of all increased real property assessments which exceed 25 per cent of the preceding year's assessment.

However, the new legislation also provides that in counties exceeding 4,000,000 population (only Los Angeles), the assessor can utilize publication as an alternative to mail notice.

"Since some method of notification must be determined for next year's assessment roll, I think it advisable that we study this problem right away," Hahn said.

Hahn asked the Chief Administrative Officer, Assessor, county counsel and Tax collector to report on the papers, costs compared to mail notice, and other pros and cons which will help the Board of Supervisors make a "solid judgement in time for the 1964 assessment roll."
