## THINGS TO SEE IN SOUTHLAND

The 11th Annual Mobile Home and Trailer Show in Los Angeles, the Norwalk Days, and the Horseless Carriage Field Meet in Arcadia top the list of things to see in the Southland this week. Here is the schedule of activities in the area for the period through Oct. 19 as compiled by the Automobile Club of Southern California.

**Oktoberfest**  
Oktoberfest will be held at Chula Vista Gymnasium, Oct. 19 beginning at 7:30 p.m., and Oct. 20 at 1:30 p.m. International folk dances will be performed at this festival.

The Padua Hills Theatre, Claremont, will present "Bien Venidos a Mexico," a potpourri of songs and unusual dances of Old Mexico, through Nov. 9.

Hollywood Park in Inglewood, Harness Racing, will be held through Nov. 16.

**Good Ol' Days**  
Good Ol' Days will be held in Long Beach Oct. 17 through 19. The event, will take place on Pine Ave. between 1st and 7th Sts., featuring a circus act, and a car show.

**Los Angeles Activities**  
The Los Angeles County Museum will feature Fossil Freshwater Fish of Western America through Nov. 3. An exhibition of fossil fish from the Green River Formation, selected mainly from the prize collection of Robert L. Lynch, will be presented by the Vertebrate Paleontology Section of the Earth Sciences Division.

Featured at the same time in the museum will be an exhibit of plant specimens selected from the award-winning collection of Mr. George Schrader.

Masterworks of Mexican Art will be featured in the museum through Jan., 1964. This is the largest and most comprehensive exhibition ever organized of the history of Mexican art covering over 3,000 years and containing over 2,000 objects. For the last 2 years, the exhibition

has toured most of the major capitols of Europe. Chamber music is provided each Sunday at 3 p.m. in the museum.

The 11th Annual Mobile Home and Trailer Show will be held Oct. 17 through 20th. Over 250 trailers, all sizes and types, new models priced as high as \$50,000 will be spread over a quarter million square feet in the park-like setting at the Great Western Exhibit Center, just off the Santa Ana Freeway.

The 2nd Annual Furniture Fashions Exposition will be held in the L.A. Sports Arena, Oct. 19 through 27th.

**Norwalk Days**  
The Norwalk Days will be held Oct. 17 through 20. Norwalk honors its Sister City, Hermosillo, Mexico, whose officials and leading citizens will lead the "Piesta Time" theme parade on the 19th. One hundred of the best "fast draw" contestants in the West will compete for the "Fastest Gun Alive" title on the 19th and 20th. There will be a public square dance until noon Oct. 20.

Decorators and Antique Show will be held at Earl Warren Showgrounds, Santa Barbara, Oct. 16 at 7 p.m., and Oct. 17 through 20 from 1 to 11 p.m.

The First Annual Jungles Fall Festival, Thousand Oaks, will be held Oct. 19 and 20, and Oct. 26 and 27. This year's theme will be "Circus Time," which will present children's TV favorites. The Delphino's, world's smallest married couple, will manage the Baby Zoo; biggest collection of midget and dwarf animals in the USA. Prizes for the most unusual hat with a Jungles theme will be given away. Children will receive balloons and attach their names to them. Balloons will be freed at appointed hour and all returned bring prizes to owner and finder.

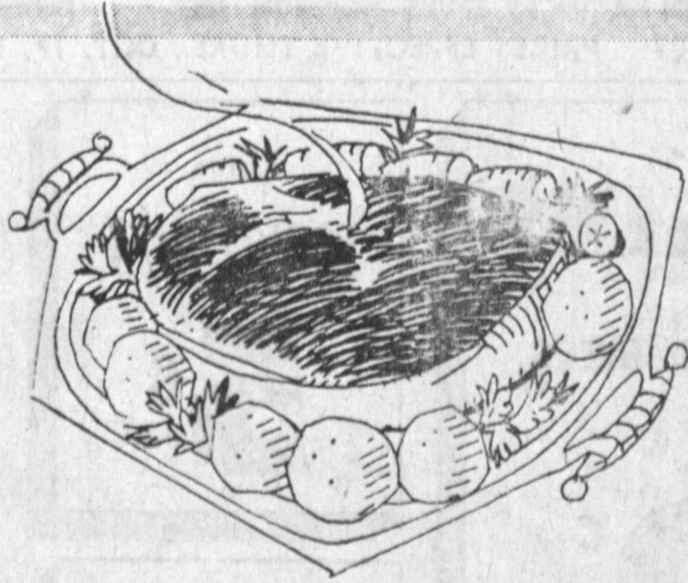

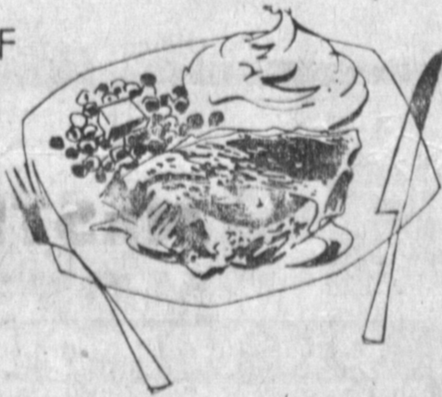
