Torrance Housewife Named Queen for Day

"Baby furniture for the second chance to love again" was the way Mrs. Margie Roberts of 21921 Marjorie Avenue, expressed herself when she made her wish on Jack Bailey's Queen for a Day program to be broadcast Tuesday, Oct. 15.

Mrs. Roberts won the Queen's crown with her wish after explaining to Bailey and the studio audience that she and her husband plan to adopt a baby in the near future and that they no longer have the baby furniture once in their home.

During her interview with MC Bailey Mrs. Roberts said that her son was killed in June this year. The baby was 2½ years old. He was hit by a truck. She further explained that after the accident she and her husband

had given away all the baby furniture.

"Soon," she said, "a new baby will be given to us. We have arranged to adopt a new-born youngster, and, of course, we once again need baby furniture."

To make ready for the expected arrival in late December or early January MC Bailey granted Queen Margie's wish with a Lullabye crib and chest, a supply of Curity baby items, Carnation food products, a high chair and stroller.

In addition Mrs. Roberts received a number of other household gifts including a rug, a freezer, a dishwasher, a Niagara lounge chair and a sewing machine.

Mrs. Roberts appearance at the show which was videotaped two weeks in advance of its broadcast date was al-

most by accident. She had accompanied her girl friend, Mrs. C. W. Gilbert of Redondo Beach, and said, "I really didn't come for myself."

Queen Margie's husband, Michael, is employed as a plasterer in Hermosa Beach. Michael and his brother, Ted, operate their own company there.

The Roberts have lived in Torrance for one month. Prior to moving to Torrance they lived in Redondo Beach and have made their home there since 1949.

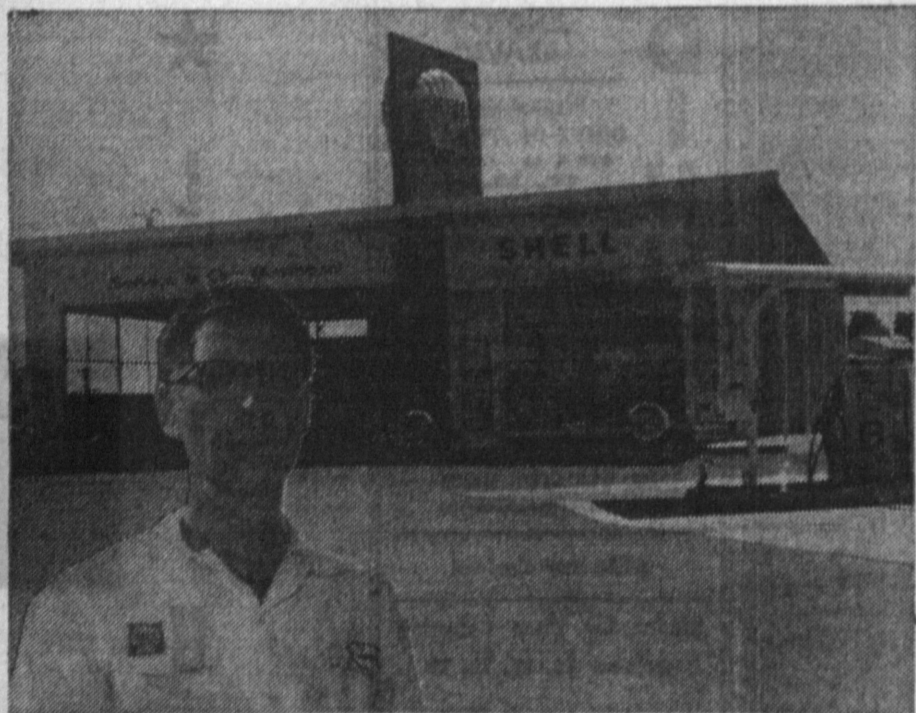
