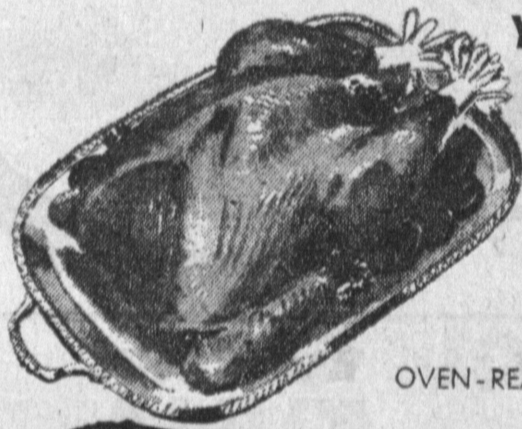

fect snack to satisfy after-school or pre-bedtime hunger.

Try some of the "slice 'n bake" refrigerator cookies now on the market too. They're well worth the added cents when you're in a hurry and need something for a bridge party or drop-in guests.

These recipes are favorites of many of our customers—we think you'll enjoy making and serving these favorites for all sorts of occasions.

**Caramel Brownies**  
1 cup shortening  
1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)  
1/4 tsp. salt  
1 tsp. vanilla  
1 egg  
1 cup sifted flour  
1 tsp. baking powder  
1/3 cup chopped nuts  
Blend together shortening, brown sugar, salt and vanilla. Add flour, sifted with baking powder. Mix until smooth and stir in nuts.

Spread in oiled shallow pan (about 9 inches square) lined with waxed paper. Bake at 350 deg. for 25 to 30 minutes. Turn out cake rack and remove paper. Cool. Cut into squares.

**Butterscotch Slices**  
3/4 cups sifted flour  
3 tsp. baking powder  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1 cup chopped dates or raisins  
2 eggs  
1 cup finely chopped nuts  
1 cup shortening  
1 1/2 cups firmly packed brown sugar  
1/2 tsp. vanilla  
To flour add baking powder and salt and mix well; then sift into bowl. Stir in fruit and nuts. Cream shortening; beat in sugar gradually, then vanilla and eggs, one at a time. Stir in flour. Shape into rolls about 2 inches thick. Wrap each in waxed paper. Chill in refrigerator until hard. Bake as needed, cutting rolls in 1/4 inch slices. Place on ungreased baking sheet and bake 400 deg. for eight min-

**Ginger Creams**  
2 cups sifted flour  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1 tsp. ginger  
1/2 tsp. nutmeg  
1/2 tsp. cloves  
1/2 tsp. cinnamon  
1/4 cup shortening  
1/2 cup sugar  
1 egg  
1/2 cup molasses  
1/2 cup hot water  
1 tsp. soda  
Sift flour, salt and spices together. Cream shortening, add sugar gradually and cream well. Beat in egg and molasses. Add dry ingredients alternately with hot water in which soda has been dissolved.

Chill dough thoroughly. Drop by teaspoonfuls, about 2" apart on a lightly oiled baking sheet. Bake 8 to 10 minutes at 400 deg.

**Thin White Icing**  
Cover tops of some of the cookies, while still warm, with icing made by blending together 1/2 cup sifted confectioners sugar, a few drops of vanilla and 2 to 3 table-spoons cream (just enough to make icing easy to spread).
