

Torrance Police Chief Perby Bennett failed to appear this morning in answer to a subpoena at a hearing conducted by the State Attorney General's office into alleged irregularities in the police department,

Officials at Torrance Memorial Hospital, told THE PRESS that Chief Bennett was admitted there Thursday evening in what was described as "a severe weak condition." Attending physician was listed as Dr. Woodrow Weiss of Torrance.

A spokesman from Attorney General Stanley Mosk's office said that the chief was served again this morning in his hospital room with a new subpoena after City Manager Wade Peebles notified the state that Bennett would not be able to appear at the hearing. The new order directs the chief to be present Wednesday, officials said.
