The case finally reached the City Council on September 24. The Council immediately surmised that there existed considerable confuion as to the exact zoning. n order to clarify and esablish legal zoning for the roperty, they decided it yould have to be zoned R-1 n accordance with the Planning Commission's recomnendation. By an additional notion however, the Council instructed the Planning Commission to immediately institute proceedings to rezone the property to R-3 with a precise plan.

At the request of William E. Foster, resident and spokesman for the group, on October 15, Mayor Isen offiially instructed Planning Director Shartle to take imnediate action on this mater. A work session of the Planning Commission on October 30 resulted in reluctance of the Commission to take action. Continued interest managed to get the matter on the formal agenda of the Commission on November 6 The homeowners attended this meeting.

At 12:45 a.m. when the matter reached the Commission's attention that night, Chairman Halstead indicated that he was "too tired to think about the matter." No action was taken and Foster was invited to attend a study session to be held today. Chairman Halstead instructed Foster that he could not speak but could listen.
