Graham, local Air Force Recruiter, stated that applicants who qualify are commissioned as Air Force Reserve Officers in a grade commensurate and professional experience and enter active duty in that grade. The minimum tour of active duty is two years, except for male nurses who are required to serve a minimum of three years.
