Boy Scouts 'Deputized' for Clothing Collection

Boy Scouts in Los Angeles County are ringing doorbells this week, asking their neighbors to fill large paper sacks with used clothing and household articles for Good Turn Day, according to Sheriff Peter J. Pitches, chairman of the 1963 Good Turn Day clothing collection.

Pitches announced that he has "deputized" approximately 50,000 Cub Scouts, and Explorers to make the collection. The Scouts will wear miniature bronze and blue "Sheriff badges" announcing they are scout Deputies for Good Turn Day. The clothing collected will benefit four charitable agencies: Goodwill Industries, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Salvation Army and Volunteers of America.

Scouts are distributing the sacks with the request that they be filled and ready for the Scouts to pick up on Saturday, Dec. 7, which is Good Turn Day.

Each Scout will pick up the filled bags in his neighborhood and take them to a collection point. Trucks from one of the four agencies will pick up the bags during the afternoon of Dec. 7. They will be taken to Goodwill Industries and weighed, and the four agencies will share equally in the material collected by Scouts.

More than 350,000 pounds of usable articles were collected last year. This kept 1,500 handicapped workers busy during the winter renovating and cleaning the articles before they are distributed to needy families.
