The student therapist is required to pay tuition fees and other expenses but she will receive second lieutenant's pay and allowances the same as if she were on active duty.

Sergeant Staubley also emphasized that the same program is open to students possessing bachelor's degrees who meet the academic prerequisities and have been accepted for a 12month certificate mourse in an approved school of Occupational or Physical Therapy. Students who posses bachelor's degrees and have been accepted for training in an approved hospital Dietetic Internship are also elegible to apply. In thest cases the students are paid while completing the certificate course or serving the Dietetic Internship.
