

# CABRILLO SAVINGS MOVES INTO NEW LOCAL HOME

One of the South Bay area's most impressive buildings — a landmark of excellence in architectural design — is the new home of Cabrillo Savings.

On the southwest corner of the intersection of Pacific Coast Highway and Crenshaw Boulevard, the new Cabrillo Building is being hailed as an outstanding symbol of the area's progress, as well as an example of how a local business institution can make a quality contribution to the community it serves.

### Three Years

In less than three years from its opening in Rolling Hills Plaza, Cabrillo Savings was faced with the need to expand in order to keep pace

with the growth of its operations. Indiscussing the expansion, Pietro DiCarlo, president and chairman of the board of Cabrillo Savings, says: "We decided we would stay in the same immediate area — since the bulk of our customers come from this neighborhood, and this is suitable building was not available, so we decided to have one built or remodeled to fit our needs for the present, and to allow us room for continued expansion in the future."

The former location of Stacy Drug was selected, and a complete reconstruction was begun.

"We decided to make this a building that the fine people of this community would be proud of," Mr. DiCarlo says, "and the wonderful compliments we've been hearing make me able to say that we have succeeded. I certainly enjoy it when people come in and say this building is beautiful enough for anyone on Wilshire Boulevard . . . and my answer is 'Why shouldn't our buildings here be the equal of those anywhere in Los Angeles?'"

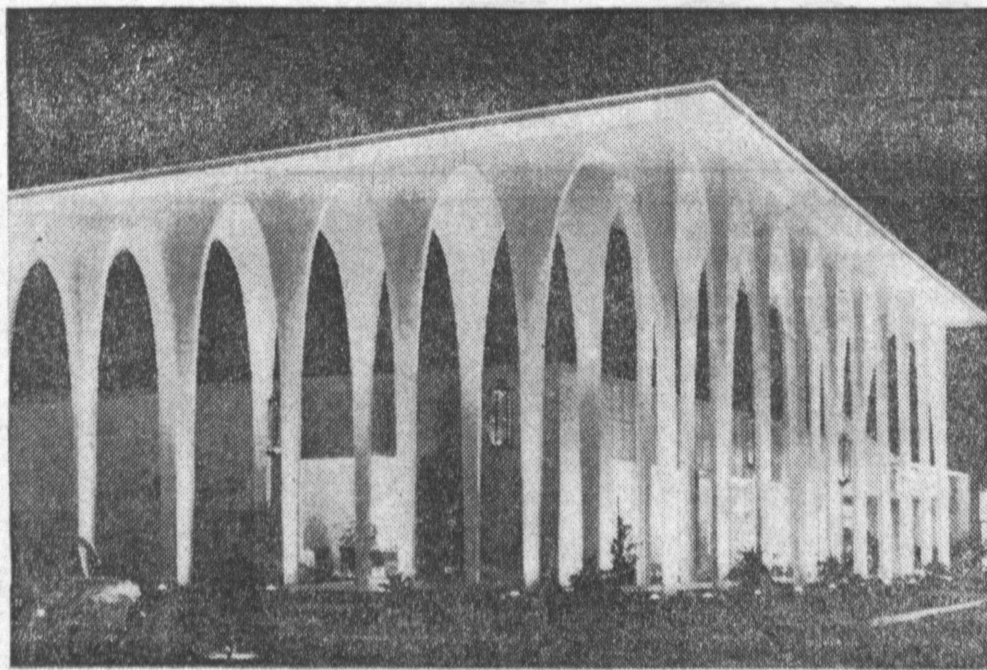
### HIGHLIGHT

Dramatic highlight of the new Cabrillo Building is the spectacular colonnade of tall concrete arches across the entire north and east elevations. The arches, each 30 feet high, are of pre-stressed concrete. Their design, according to Architect Austin Daly, is to bring to the modern building a touch of "old Spain" through the airy feeling that was so characteristic of Mediterranean architecture.

The high exterior doors, with ornamental pulls and brass plugs, are contemporary interpretations of the massive carved wooden doors used in 16th Century Mediterranean buildings. Imported Italian marble mosaics are used generously on the exterior, and the landscaping in the large parking area has also been planned in harmony with the Old World character of the entire structure.

### ATTENTION

A great deal of attention has been devoted to the aesthetic and historical touches appropriate to an
