Land Owner Acquitted in Permit Case

The City of Rolling Hill's attempt to convict longtime area resident Ted Koletos of criminal charges arising out of an attempt to fill his proposed futility this week.

Judge William B. Keene found Koletos "not guilty" in South Bay Municipal Court, Torrance, after Judges Donald Armstrong and Otto B. Willett disqualified themselves.

Violation Charged
The area land developer was charged with violating a permit to fill his 3.5-acre property on the southwest corner of Palos Verdes Drive North and Narbonne Ave.

After county officials approved his grading plans, Koletos said, they found it would make a convenient disposal for some 8000 cubic yards of earth left over from a nearby county road

project. An estimated \$8000 was saved county taxpayers because the dirt needed only to be hauled a short distance to Koletos' property.

At the time, road department officials welcomed the

chance to fill in a 35-foot deep ravine that bordered Palos Verdes, thus eliminating a severe traffic hazard. But before the fill and grading project could be completed, Rolling Hills city fa-

thers stepped in to halt Koletos' project. "City planning commissions objected to my plans," Koletos, a former area farmer, stated, "after the county had approved them and is-

used the grading permit. Every bit of the filling, grading and compacting of the dirt was done under continuous county inspection to rigid specifications," he added.

Social Security Chief Warns Area Housewives

A word of caution to housewives came today from Miles Davis, district manager here for social security. According to Davis, many housewives do not know that their maids, cooks, gardeners, and other household help are covered by social security. Some housewives in the South Bay area have had to pay up back social security taxes, plus interest and a penalty because they failed to make social security reports on time.

Davis emphasized that social security coverage for household workers is not optional. "If the worker is paid cash wages of \$50 a quarter by one employer, she's under social security," he said. He cited the recent case of a cleaning woman who worked only one day a week. Although she worked for one family only, and made only \$4 a day, this was enough to bring her work under social security. weeks in a calendar quarter, she was being paid \$52 a quarter. Her employer must make a report at the end of each quarter and send in the social security tax on the wages.

Social security reports for the October, November, December quarter are due by Jan. 31. The reports go to the District Director of Internal Revenue in Los Angeles. Housewives may get the report forms sent to them after they fill out and mail a postcard form available at the Torrance social security office.

Davis pointed out that the tax is shared equally by the housewife and the worker. The tax for each is 3-5/8 per cent. The housewife deducts the worker's tax from her pay and sends a check for the total tax with the report.

The Torrance social security office at 1408 Crenshaw has a booklet which explains social security coverage for household workers in detail. The booklets are free and include the postcard a housewife needs to mail to get the report forms from the Internal Revenue Service. 50th Birthday Observed for AF Silver Wings

Air Force Chief of Staff, General Curtis E. LeMay said in Washington, D.C. recently that today's wearers of the Silver Wings badge have rededicated themselves to continue to serve the nation in a manner that future wearers can look back and say, "They have done their job well."

General LeMay made the statement in connection with the 50th anniversary of the authorization of the distinctive wings which identify military persons engaged in aerial missions.

The anniversary period is being observed from October through December to coincide with the first-award of Military "Silver Wings" to two Army Signal Corps pilots during October, 1913.

The general said, "It is appropriate that we pause to mark this important anniversary. The Silver Wings of the Air Force pilot, observer, navigator and crew member are a symbol of the United States Air Force."

He said, too, that the badge is the mark of professionals "imbued with dedication to their country and to the mission to which they have been charged."
