## •Water Level In Torrance Will Not Drop

The Fall water basin level in Torrance will remain the same as last year, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Chace said levels in water basins in many areas of the County will be lower this Fall because of a continuing ser-ies of dry years extending over nearly two decades.

"This is particularly alarm-ing when we realize more than 50 percent of Los Angeles County's daily water supply is pumped from these sources," the Supervisor said.


