

# Court Upholds Method Of Wage Deductions

Internal Revenue regulations requiring employers to deduct and withhold income tax from each wage payment to employees have been upheld in the U. S. District Court.

In a recent test of regulations which interpret the tax withholding provisions of the law, the U. S. District Court for the Northern District of West Virginia rejected an employer withholding plan under which required income taxes are deducted from one out of four weekly paychecks.

**RULING IN A** suit brought against the Government by A. Karl Summers president of Premier Photo Service, Inc., Judge Charles F. Paul said:

"The Congress undoubtedly had more than the collection of taxes under consideration in devising its plan. The Congress extended to employees the 'easy installment payment' plan so extensively advertised in commercial selling.

"The Congress, and properly so, sought to avoid the impact of a too large deduction from a single pay, which the plaintiffs' device entails. The regulation simply carries out the Congressional intent discernible from the statutes themselves, and is a valid exercise of the administrative regulatory powers."

**BERTRAND M. Harding**, acting commissioner of Internal Revenue, said that the court decision reaffirms the agency's position that any withholding plan which defers the time of withholding is in violation of the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.

It is not permissible, for example, for the employers to defer withholding of the income tax from the first, second or third paychecks in a month, and then withhold the accumulated tax liability of the employee from the fourth pay period.

In addition to failing to meet the requirement of law, such a plan could work hardship on the employee, Mr. Harding said. The employee who does not carefully budget his income might find the amount of his last paycheck of the month insufficient to meet his expenses.

**MR. HARDING** called attention to Sections 7512 and 7215 of the Internal Revenue Code. These provide that any employer required to collect, truthfully account for and pay over these taxes, and who fails to do so at the time and manner prescribed by the law and regulations may be required to deposit such taxes in a special trust account for the United States Government, and file monthly returns.

The payments into the special account in such circumstances must be made within two days of very payday. Severe penalties are provided by law for failure to make deposits and payments when the prescribed notice to do so has been issued to the employer.

# Harbor College Reports Registration Nears Peak

grams. The Admissions Office will be open daily from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and evenings from 5:30 to 8:30 Monday through Thursday.
