



Calvary Hires Last Instructor

With the hiring of Paul Cameron Reese, the faculty of the Calvary Baptist Elementary School, 2818 Manhattan Beach Blvd., is complete for the coming year. He will teach the fifth grade.

Reese received his bachelor of arts degree from BIOLA College in La Mirada in Christian Education. His wife is working on a similar degree there. Reese ultimately plans to go into missionary work. He has already had special missionary training in Mexico with the Wycliffe Bible Translators.

He has studied phonics and phonetic systems at the University of Oklahoma and has learned how to reduce previously unwritten languages to phonetic symbols.

Reese's training in phonics will be useful in the teaching of reading at the school because the phonics method is consistently used. He is currently teaching a sixth grade Sunday school class at the Church of the Open Door in Los Angeles.

Press-Journal Honored On 100th Anniversary

The Press-Journal and Harbor Mail, the Los Angeles harbor "green sheet" which has been recording waterfront news for a century, has been honored with admission to the California State Fair's 100 Year Club.

The Press-Journal was one of 30 historic firms to be hosted at a special luncheon by the fair's board of directors today.

Gov. Edmund G. "Pat" Brown presented plaques to the members of the club during the luncheon and informal award ceremonies.

The Press-Journal and Harbor Mail, now published by King Williams Press, Inc., which also publishes the Press-Herald, was established by Phineas Banning as the Journal in 1864. At that time, the Wilmington Journal was published weekly and sold for 12½ cents.

In 1927, the C. P. Roberts family, owners of the Wilmington Press, purchased the Journal and merged the two papers into the Press-Journal.

The Press-Journal was purchased by Edward L. Fike in 1959 and was merged with the Harbor Mail in 1962. King Williams Press acquired the newspaper earlier this year.

NEW RESIDENTS who have been in the state for at least 54 days but do not meet all resident requirements may vote for president and vice-

president. They must register with the County Registrar of Voters, 808 N. Spring St., Los Angeles.

All other voters must have lived in California for one year, in the county for 90 days and in the precinct for 54 days. Persons who have changed their address, legal name, or party affiliation since the last general election must register.

Complete lists of deputy registrars in Torrance are maintained at all libraries and at the City Clerk's office at City Hall. A deputy registrar also is available at City Hall between 8 a. m. and 5 p. m. daily.
