WHEN MAYOR Albert Isen asked Friedman if he had a client who was seeking a Torrance location for panguingue, Friedman said yes. "That is emergency enough for me," Isen declared.

Under questioning by Remelmeier, Friedman admitted he represented Melvin Wallich, who is presently looking for a location in Torrance. Friedman would not further identify Wallich.

Friedman told the council he believed the California Supreme Court would uphold the District Court of Appeals decision, which declared local control of gambling unconstitutional. Remelmeier then told the council in such a case, ordinances regulating card games could be enforced.

ALL THREE ordinances were adopted by a unanimous council.

Friedman suggested the ordinances would be challenged in court, to which Council-

man H. T. "Ted" Olson said, "If A, B and C don't work, then we'll come up with a D, E and F." Olson's reference was to labeling of the three ordinances for discussion.

Regular ordinances will be submitted at a later date.
