Korean GI Bill Ends In January

The final semester of col-The final semester of college or vocational school training under the Korean GI Bill gets under way this month, according to Mort Webster, manager of the YA's Southern California regional office.

When the semester ends in January, 1965, it also will mark the end of the education and training program under the Korean G Bill.

More than 2,300,000 veterans of the Korean Conflict have taken advantage of the program, Webster said.

THE JANUARY closing date will apply to both veterans who have already embarked on a course of study and to those veterans beginning a course of study this month. Veterans may continue in school after that date, but the VA monthly living and training allowance will be discontinued.
