### County Studies Bids On Probation Office

An apparent low bid of \$322,500 to construct a Harbor Probation Department Building in Torrance has been filed by the Parr Contracting Co. of Culver City.

The Parr bid, lowest of nine submitted, was \$85,000 lower than the Engineer's estimate for the job, according to Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

As chairman of Courts in Los Angeles County, Hahn believes that public buildings should be in regional areas so the citizens won't have to travel long distances to conduct County business.

The purpose of the Probation Offices, he said, was to provide for those who have
