

City Steel Plant Wins New Honors

Bethlehem Steel Company's Torrance Structural Steel Fabricating Works has been awarded a Certificate of Achievement in the 1963-1964 Metals Section Safety Contest of the National Safety Council. It was announced today by John E. Jacobs, vice president in charge of Bethlehem's steel operations.

The Works had an accident frequency rate below its group average and a reduction in rate of at least 15 per cent in comparison with its rate for the previous three years.
