Law in Action

Our Constitution protects us against unlawful trespass ers into our homes. But what about today's elec-

tronic eavesdroppers?

They do not fall under our law of trespass. With long range cameras and telescopes, snoopers can look for miles into your windows. And recopers can pick up, talk snoopers can pick up talk from afar, or eavesdrop from next door. The laws have few protections against cameras, telescopes and such devices. And their use is widespread both in public and private in-vestigations. Of late electron-ic listeners have a few more limitations. limitations.

TRUE, IN 1934 Congress outlawed telephone wire tap-ping. But Congress and the courts have not limited other devices, where there is no ac-tual trespass. California has a

There are many court cases involving someone who con cealed a microphone or "bug' on his person to record what he hears. Such recordings are he hears. Such recordings are useful for police who can play the recording back in court, since it may be used if one party to a conversation can identify the recording.

In a recent case federal agents had driven a "pike mike" a half inch into a wall to hear a "gambler talk. Since

to hear a gambler talk. Since the mike stuck into the wall half an inch, the court held that this was trespass, and unlawful intrusion. Since the law forbade this sort of thing, court would not hear the

evidence. In 1963 California passed laws to protect persons from some abuses of electronic listening devices. It is a crime, for example, to eavesdrop or to record a "confidential communication" between persons.

No court can admit such an eavesdropping or recording in evidence.

BUT WHAT IS "confiden-tial communications?" It is one carried on in such a way that the parties wanted the discussion confided to them-

The law still permits a reording for use in court where one party has consented to its use. If someone secretly records his talk faceto-face, the courts are likely to allow it in evidence. Non-confidential communi-

cations such as public speech es, of course, have no such protection.
