

Zoo Gets Kawa Kai Collection

The entire collection of 135 birds and mammals from the Kwa Kai Bird Farm in Ocean side has been purchased by the Greater Los Angeles Zoo Association and is being moved to Griffith Park Zoo. This is a tremendously important acquisition for the Greater Los Angeles Zoo, explained Mrs. Reese Taylor, Chairman of the Association's Animal Acquisition Committee.

Transfer of the animals began today and will continue through Monday, Mrs. Taylor declared. Although several specimens such as flamingos are difficult to move without injury, the transfer of the first shipment of animals from Oceanside to Los Angeles was accomplished without loss. Transfer operations are being conducted by the Greater Los Angeles Zoo staff.

Among prize specimens obtained at the auction are a pair of hyacinth macaws, a large bird of spectacular color and extremely rare and valuable. Also in the collection were a pair of leadbeater cocalos which are difficult to obtain outside Australia and are considered as among the world's most beautiful birds.

LARGEST BIRDS in the collection are two emus, six flamingos, two ocellated turkeys distinguished from its better-known relative by brighter copper colors, and two crowned cranes. Also in the collection are five black birds, swans, four white swans, three black-necked swans, and four peacocks. There is also a pair of sheep-eating parrots known as kea parrots. One of the bird newcomers is a large mynah bird earmarked for the Children's Zoo where he is expected to become a great favorite because of his unusual ability to mimic human voices.

Animals in the collection include a herd of nine Barbary Coast sheep, eight fallow deer, a spider monkey and a gibbon. There are also numerous rare and colorful parrots, ducks and American
