Purchase of the right-of-way would clear the way for the opening of Del Amo Boulevard from its present terminus at Wayne Avenue to Prospect Avenue in Redondo Beach. Cost of the parcel, owned by Pacific Electric Railway Co., is estimated at \$2,000.
