(Continued from Page A-1) served and reaffirmed a policy statement on the T-hanger question adopted by the Airport Commission. Efforts will be made today, however, to secure permission from the Army to relocate the buildings.

If that permission is denied, the buildings will be removed so that construction of the drainage project may proceed.

In other action, the council:

Continued a hearing on a variance which would permit a three-unit apartment at 3920 W. 182nd St., then ordered the Planning Department to study zoning along 182nd Street. A report must be submitted within 30 days.

Adopted on first reading an ordinance which will allow the city to regulate the height of trees and shrubs blocking a driver's view when entering a street from a private drive.

Renewal (Continued from Page A-1) council ordered several weeks ago. Work on that plan is expected to require about 18 months. That plan, when adopted, will replace the present plan.)

Taking a brief recess from their duties as councilmen, the city fathers adjourned and reconvened as the Redevelopment Agency to adopt the by-laws of that body. Under the by-laws, councilmen become members of Redevelopment Agency with Mayor Albert Isen serving as chairman. Other city officials will serve as officers of the agency.

CITY MANAGER Edward J. Ferraro will be the secretary and executive director of the agency.

That done, the council became the council again and officially declared the airport area blighted and established it as the Meadow Park Redevelopment Area.

Organization in hand, the council will be able to proceed with the development of plans for the area and submit a formal application for federal funds. Some property will be purchased in the interim with city funds, thereby eliminating some hardships on property owners in the area.

Eventually, the city will acquire most of the property in an area bounded by Madison Street on the east, Lomita Boulevard on the north, Hawthorne Avenue on the west and Pacific Coast Highway on the south. An industrial leasehold development similar to the commercial complex at the east end of the airport is to be established.
