Supervisor Charges

Home, School Roots Of Delinquent Youth

"The cause of juvenile delinquency is the lack of sound training in the home, school discipline, and respect for law and order in the community," stated Supervisor Kenneth Hahn in response to the proposed \$198,000 county contract for a private firm to study juvenile delinquency.

Hahn's protest was issued following the Board of Supervisors move to form a new Juvenile Delinquency Crime Commission to study the causes of juvenile delinquency and how to combat it, followed by the request of a committee formed a year ago to spend \$198,000 for a survey to "develop recommendations" for preventing, combatting, and reducing juvenile delinquency.

"We have shelves and shelves of studies and reports on this subject which gather dust," continued Hahn. "Statistics and studies are in the files of the FBI, the Sheriff, Police Department, Courts, California Department of Justice, California Youth Authority, and Probation Office. They are in public agencies and need only be taken from the shelves.

"The problem of juvenile delinquency is as big as life itself. It is complex and far-reaching. But the answers are simple and easy to find. They are in the Ten Command-
